1860. Was married Aug 21. Installed at Hamlington as Pastor Oct. 11. devoted myself to my pastoral work at H. for ten years.
1861. Assisted by public addresses to raise men and money for the war
1862. Visited Hospitals in Washington D.C. as a delegate of Christian Commission.
1863. At the Battle of Gettysburg. and three weeks after as delegate C. C.
