

Constitution of the Congregational Temperance Society

Article 1. This organization shall be called The Congregational Temperance Society.

Article 2. The members stand pledged not to use intoxicating drinks as a beverage, and to promote the cause of Temperance by all appropriate means.

Article 3. Any person may become a member of this association by signing the Constitution.

Article 4. The Annual meeting for choice of officers shall be held in the month of May of each year.

Article 5. The officers shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary & Treasurer, and three Managers.

Article 6. The Board of Officers shall determine upon the time and place of holding the meetings

of the Society, and the exercises at such meetings.

Article 7. This constitution may be altered or amended at any meeting of the Society notice of the proposed amendment having been previously given.

Resolved, That inasmuch as the Spirit
of War is unquestionably opposed to
the precepts. Example and Spirit
of Jesus Christ. This Congress ^{should}
appeal to all who ^{cooperate} bear the
Christian name to ^{cooperate} with us
in the prevention and final abolition
of War from the Earth.
