

Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> August 1833

Agreed to leave the machine with Nicholas Gyps  
if he did not conclude to buy to write a week  
from Saturday went up & got the board of the  
Blake Horse and took him down to Gyps  
repacked the waggon and Tarbox and myself

Friday 15<sup>th</sup> Started for Waltham with three horses wrote  
forty or fifty miles put up in Balton

Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> Rode in to town <sup>Waltham</sup> found life in good  
spirit some prospect of selling here yet  
Conferred with Van Vorst about repair  
of Jey mangle <sup>for a week</sup> went to see the mangle  
machine &

Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> went to church two or three times feel  
some better very sore lip neck better some

Monday 19<sup>th</sup>

Rose at 5 went 7 miles saw Sherman

Van Vorst & others come home wrote to

Delevin Stimpson, Child & I Hart prepared

to take a machine out to <sup>the</sup> Lake Pillsbury

went out & exhibited & passed a round by half  
returned with the machine to Lake

Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> went from 12 to 15 miles through the sand  
with a machine set up at Sherman had  
some spectators no sale

Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> Rose early went & showed the machine  
to a number they would not buy a  
pair of wheels to a machine but not the price  
returned within a mile & half sick fatigued  
and sorry come down to Lake after tea

Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> Remained at Lake Tarbox went to Albany  
Very unwell all this day home sick home sick  
should be glad to have my wife name me

Friday 23 Went up to Mr Almsden and exhibit a machine  
to a number of spectators all well pleased no sale  
Yet came home found Jesse D. had just arrived  
from Cannajoharie

Saturday 24 Sent for the horses and exhibited a machine  
at Mr Ten Broeks all the village came  
to see all admired the operation but  
affected no sale rode in the evening to  
Frog to see The Pictures of Adam & Eve  
Surprising painting surpassing any thing  
I ever saw Oh that my dear Eliza had  
been with me

Sunday 25 went to Church after which wrote  
to Mr Gardiner a long letter reques-  
ting to be recalled

Monday 26 traded horses with Cannajoharie  
\$50 to boot went out to see Pebles and  
sold 1/4 machine

Tuesday 27 sold 1/4 to Emma & Travis and 1/4  
to Almsden and exchanged horses  
with him and let him ride Charles  
Jesse D. started for man and  
I for Cannajoharie came over the  
rail Road and thus took the packet  
from Schenectady

Wednesday 28 Arrived at Cannajoharie this morning  
had an interview with Mr. He nothing done  
to my advantage sent some Adventure nuts

about the country & the

Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> went out to Mr Groves saw the machine  
no one appeared to buy time dull could raise but  
a little attention from others to my business returned  
to Mr Groves read in the evening Gill Blas

Friday 30<sup>th</sup> Rose in the morning went to the office  
found a letter from my dear wife and set down  
to answer it sent some advertisements up the canal

Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> Conversed with many about machines  
Groves wrote instead of better mail a  
letter to my wife

Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> September While at church Tarbot come  
had broke the machine at Johnston the chain  
come to pieces & he had broke the cog wheel a  
sad affair wrote to Chandler for an other and  
to Delevan to go to Wetherford for a machine

Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> Went to Saltzman Ehles Nelson and also  
over Palestine they liked the machine well  
but would not buy until they see another go  
that is to be set up at Lips went to see it  
think it will not thrash clean went to Foxes  
and Groves told him to keep the machine until  
they gave him \$175 dollars returned to Groves

Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> Gery Saltzman came down in char  
of his father took his note of fifty dollars

Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> went to Saltzman took the old man  
note for \$5 and \$125 the promise to be done  
it but when I came made excuse said  
it was not worth right no letter can  
do nothing more to advantage shall start  
to Johnston tomorrow

Thursday 5 machine arrived from Watterford this morning sold it to Mr John T. She for his grey horse \$75 dollars in a note and he paid the freight \$2.50

Took the stage & wagon for Mr Briggs Johnston Friday 6 went to Fultonville got the new wheel went to thrashing the rounds came out caught in the machine and finally broke the new wheel I started back to Watterford with both horses to send one as soon as possible

Saturday 7 went out and invited company to see the machine morning

Sunday 8 stayed at Briggs until midnight and went to the farm then sent for the wheel

Monday 9 went early about a mile and brought the wheel on my back fixed it and had on two wire put it on and went to thrashing the wages soon became loose I fastened them with new ones but had done but little before the shoe caught his hind shoes tore them both of and the pole strap came out of the machine

Tuesday 10 got his shoes put on again and the wheel become loose again fastened that and thrashed a little and left the machine in tolerable good order & good credit as can be expected

Went to Watterford via Scherecton & Albany

Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> Went in the morning called on  
Mr Eli Gould walked with him to see  
over a chip in stone took stage for  
Wattsford arrived at noon left & had not  
arrived went up to see the Grey Cross

Friday 13<sup>th</sup> Mr Pepples came and wanted us  
to put in machine in order had got out  
of repair David may letter wrote me to Ward  
Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 16<sup>th</sup>  
went up to see the machine but down the shaft  
and wheels to the shop

Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> went to church 3 times this day & evening

Monday 16<sup>th</sup> went up with the work men carried  
the wheels of the machine sawed and  
put it together and think it will be now  
permanent returned and found a man from  
Princeton Schenecady Co 2 1/2 miles from Rotterdam  
Browns Store house on the Canal 10 miles  
from Schenecady want to see a machine  
but could not stop then would call again

Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> Presented Elias Kote for \$75 to the  
Directors and after some time got  
it discounted rec'd \$73.44  
Mr Davis spoke well of the endeavor

Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> Had some talk with Mr Beach of Chittanning  
but could not sell him any territory until he  
knew more of the machine wrote to Mr  
Bryant near Albany and to Guff & Page  
Phelps Ontario Co &c &c

Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> Racy day nothing done Lonsome  
and Palmest bird waiting for Robinson  
Went to the shop and charged them to make the  
Friday machine so it will hold together in future  
To a Mr Samuel S. Wheeler of Westons Albany  
called I went to the shop showed the  
machine as well as I could in its present  
state he said if he could get some to  
join he would buy would let us know  
soon

Saturday 21 went to the shop to see about the machines  
no business a coming of consequence today  
read Paulding notes of travels - good

Sunday 22 Went to Churchsee

Monday 23 Recd a letter from Joseph Wing of  
Duaneburgh Shohanic Co and answered it. and  
directed La. Esperiencie Shohanic Co.

Tuesday 24 went to the shop to try to hurry  
on the completion of the machines  
no calls read Brant B. Hall

Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup>  
Mr Hayward of Greenbush Bensalem Co

Wanted to see a machine saw it liked it  
thinks he shall buy with Mr Hetchum and  
others in Schenectada where he says  
you will join to buy at the they have not  
seen one yet have recd my letter respecting the
