RATES OF POSTAGE.

DOMESTIC.

All Transient Matter, except duly certified letters of soldiers and sailors, must be prepaid by stamps. No package will be forwarded which weighs over four pounds, except books published or circulated by order of Congress.

VALUABLE LETTERS may be registered by the payment of a registration fee of 15 cents.

CHARGES FOR MONEY ORDERS.—Money can be sent with absolute safety by mail by procuring a Money Order. The fees are, on orders not exceeding \$20, ten cents; over \$20 and not exceeding \$30, fifteen cents; over \$30 and not exceeding \$40, twenty cents; over \$40 and not exceeding \$50, twenty-five cents.

On all LETTERS throughout the UNITED STATES, 3 cents for each half-ounce or fraction thereof.

DROP OR LOCAL LETTERS, 2 cents where there is a free carrier's delivery. All other offices, 1 cent.

PRINTED BOOKS, in one package, to one address, 4 cents for each 4 ounces or fraction thereof.

CIRCULARS, unsealed, not exceeding three in number to one address, 2 cents; the same rate for every three or less number additional.

On all TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS, or other PRINTED MATTER (Books and Circulars excepted,) and on all Seeds, Cuttings, &c. Pamphlets, Book MSS. and Proof Sheets, Maps, Engravings, Blanks, Patterns, Envelopes, and Photographs, contained in one package, to one address, 2 cents for each 4 ounces or fraction thereof.

On all matter not above specified, same rate as letters.

FOREIGN.

We are obliged to print our Diaries for 1871 so early in 1870, that it is impossible to be correct in rates of foreign postage. We think there will be no change in the following; but our Government is at present negotiating new rates to France and the German States, and we omit these altogether rather than mislead.

On LETTERS TO GREAT BRITAIN AND IRELAND.—For every half-ounce or fraction thereof, 6 cents, if prepaid. If not prepaid, 6 cents extra will be collected in Great Britain, and 6 cents in the United States.

To THE DOMINION OF CANADA, per half-ounce, any distance, 6 cents, if prepaid; if not paid, 10 cents.

To other BRITISH NORTH-AMERICAN PROVINCES, not over 3,000 miles, 10 cents per half-ounce; over 3,000 miles, 15 cents per half-ounce; prepayment compulsory.

PLANETS BRICHTSET.

PLANETS.—
The indiscriminate use of all kinds of stamps (except postage or proprietary) is permitted, care being taken to affix a stamp or stamps of the proper amount.

Documents made in any foreign country, to be used in the United States, shall pay the same duty as when made here.

Powers of Attorney, or other papers relating to applications for bounties, arrearages of pay, or pensions, require no stamp; neither do indorsement of negotiable instrument, nor any warrant of attorney accompanying a bond or note when such bond or note shall be stamped; and whenever any bond or note shall be secured by mortgage, but one stamp duty is required, provided the stamp duty placed thereon is the highest rate required for said instrument, or either of them.

The person using or affixing the stamp or stamps, shall write thereupon the initials of his name and the date upon which the same shall be attached or used, so that the same shall not be used again, under a penalty of \$50; and they may be otherwise canceled as the Commissioner of Internal Revenue may prescribe.

Violations of these Stamp Duties will be punished as the law directs.

ECLIPSES FOR 1871.

There will be four Eclipses this year.

I.—A PARTIAL ECLIPSE OF THE MOON, January 6, in the evening, visible east of Minnesota and Alabama. The Moon will rise between 4h. 35m. and 5h. 7m. with the Eclipse upon it, and, being on the decrease, and on the southern limb, in the north-east parts of the United States the greatest magnitude of 8.316 digits will be visible. At New York the Eclipse ends at 5h. 51m.; at Boston, 6h. 3m.; at Rochester, 6h. 42m.; at Philadelphia, 5h. 47m.; and at Washington, 5h. 39m.

II.—AN ANNUAL ECLIPSE OF THE SUN, June 17, invisible in America.

III.—A PARTIAL ECLIPSE OF THE MOON, July 2, invisible east of California, Oregon and Alaska.

IV.—A TOTAL ECLIPSE OF THE SUN, December 11, invisible in America.

MORNING STARS.

VENUS from Sept. 26 to end of year.

JUPITER from June 30 to October 22.

SATURN until March 30,

EVENING STARS.

VENUS until Sept. 26, Mars all the year.

JUPITER until June 30, and after Oct. 22.

SATURN from March 30 to end of the year.

PLANETS BRIGHTEST.

MERCURY, February 18, June 18 and October 6, being visible and rising before the Sun. Also, April 20, August 17 and December 12th, being visible and setting soon after the Sun.

VENUS will show splendidly in the West, August 20, and for several weeks before and after that time; also, again, November 1, being now invisible.

10 MAES comes to the opposition March 19, and rises and sets nearly with the setting and rising of the Sun.

JUPITER will not have an opposition this year.


