ECLIPSES.

There will be four Eclipses this year, and a Transit of Mercury across the Sun's disc.

- I. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, Feb. 2, invis. in America.
- II. A Partial Eclipse of the Moon, Feb. 17, in the morning, the Moon setting more or less eclipsed east of the Mississippi River. Size, 20 digits. Eclipse begins at Washington, 4h. 35m. morn.; New-York, 4h. 42m. morn.; Philadelphia, 4h. 43m. morn.
- III. A Total Eclipse of the Sun, July 20, in the afternoon, visible generally throughout the U. S. as a Partial Eclipse. Begins at N. Y., 4h. 42m.; ends, 6h. 28m.; Boston, 4h. 50m.—6h. 29m. The eclipse will be total at Galveston Bay.
- IV. A Partial Eclipse of the Moon, Aug. 12, in the evening, the Moon rising more or less eclipsed east of Kansas, west of which no eclipse will be visible. Eclipse ends at New-York, 8h. 26m.; Boston, 8h. 30m.; Washington, 8h. 26m. Size, 7.15 digits.
- V. A Transit of Mercury, May 6, visible. Begins at N.Y. City, 10h. 18m. morn.; middle, 11h. 3m. ev.; ends, 5h. 35m. ev.

PLANETS BRIGHTEST.

MERCURY, Feb. 5, June 5, Sept. 28, rising then before the Sun; also April 12, Aug. 10, Dec. 5, setting then after the Sun. VENUS, Jan. 10 and March 28. MARS, not this year. JUPITER, July 25. SATURN, Sept. 22. URANUS, Feb. 15.

MORNING STARS.

VENUS, from Feb. 20 to Dec. 5. MARS, after Sept. 18. JUPITER, from Jan. 5 to April 25. SATURN, from March 13 to June 23.

EVENING STARS.

VENUS, until Feb. 20. MARS, until Sept. 18. JUPITER, until Jan. 5 and after April 25. SATURN, until March 13 and after June 23.

VALUABLE LETTERS may be registered by the payment of a registration fee of 10 cts. MONEY can be sent with absolute safety by mail, by procuring a Money Order. The fees are: on orders not exceeding \$15, 10 cts.: \$15 to \$30, 15 cts.: \$30 to \$40, 20 cts.: \$40 to \$50, 25 cts.

PRINTED BOOKS, in one package, to one address, 1 ct. for each 2 ounces or fraction thereof, not over 4 lbs.

On TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS and other printed matter (except Circulars), 1 ct. for 2 ounces or part of 2 ounces, not over 4 lbs.

On Circulars, Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs, Roots, Scions, Samples of Merchandise (except Liquids and Glass), Minerals, Ores, Flexible Patterns, Photographs, Stereoscopic Views, Paper, Envelopes, and all other articles not from their form or nature calculated to injure the mails, 1 ct. for each ounce, not over 4 lbs.

Any package may have the name and address of the sender, with the word "From" prefixed on the wrapper, and the number and names of the articles may be attached in brief form.

All transient matter must be fully prepaid by stamps.

On matter not above specified, same rate as Letters. All matter, except Letters, must be so inclosed that a free inspection is allowed, without cutting strings or wrapper.



FOREIGN POSTAGE.
