ing

FRIDAY 30

At Albany all day. Spent afternoon in
Library reading curious rather than in-
structive law cases in the English courts.
Some "State Trials". I found two letters from
Ellis at P.O. They were "like cold water
to a thirsty soul" to Lizzie. The first she
has had since he reached Tampa.
Sent Brooke. Received letter from Ming. also
one from Leavitt at Boston. Mailed a
letter to Ella

JANUARY

SATURDAY 31

1857

No lectures on Saturdays. So at home all day.
Spent much time in Reading room at Troy. Read
Review in "Westminster" of Emerson's "English Traits".
They seem to like him better for his compliments
than for his ability as a thinker. There is a little
resemblance to "England & English" by Palmer, but
Emerson shows himself more of a Philosopher

FEBRUARY

SUNDAY 1

Went over to Troy to St. John's Church Sunday
Heard a Rev. Mr. Smith preach. He seemed
warmer in the face than the hearer but
I must judge him. Watched around the
P.O. in order to hit the proper time of getting
in. got in - but got nothing. Went can't
mean? Mrs. Waite quite sick. Lizzie seems
much worn & depressed. Note to E. & Mother

MONDAY 2

Mailed at P.O. so long this morning as
to miss my quarter before English train
& lose an lecture but no letter. Heard
Lecture from Judge Davis. Argued a
case in "Moot Court" as Junior Counsel
& lost it. Question. When does title rest
in an action of "Trespass" on Recovery of Judgment
or realization of Execution? Recd a letter
from Lizzie P.O. & her Mother from Roxbury Mass.
Read Little in the Evening

FEBRUARY

TUESDAY 3

1857

Received a "two stuffed" letter from E. Also one from Otis dated Jan. 20th Es. Jan 27.
Was at Albany all day

WEDNESDAY 4

Lost Sears Lecture this morning in account of missing train. Read Warren's Law Studies

THURSDAY 5

Visited Lantz & aparently with Mr. Lee & attended "Moot" court in P.M. I spoke on "Letter" case. Came home in omnibus

FEBRUARY

FRIDAY 6

1857

Lectured this forenoon - Next Court - in afternoon was assigned at Legion Council in case to be discussed - on the 20th - looked it up home & concluded I was on the wrong side - Wrote home to E this Evening - 9 days since I have heard Lizzie's last letter from Otis

SATURDAY 7

Went on to Troy this morning. Took "my novel" from Albany - Ordered a pair of boots for Wednesday next - At home the rest of the day - Rolled my last quarter with Lee in the bowling alley - Trains stopped by the market - Began "my novel"

SUNDAY 8

Did not go to Church today - The Hudson river broke up about two o'clock, the ice being nearly two feet thick. It looked majestically as it swept by - Got out this looking at the river - Finished a letter to E. in answer to one I received this morning - It is not to name tonight

FEBRUARY

MONDAY 9

1857

Found the water 12 feet deep between the house & the street - the loss of property is immense. Water never so high before since 1832 - not so high. Even then by a foot - No cars or stages today so I had to stay at home.

TUESDAY 10

Mailed a letter to Otis - one to E. one to H. E. P. - Can't get to Albany today except on foot - the ice bears this morning

WEDNESDAY 11

Went to Albany by stage - Reached there at 11 O'clock - Mailed letters to L. H. Stickland & Tom Leavitt -

1857

Recd. letters from Selma, Charles & E. - Did not go to Albany

FRIDAY 13

Lecture tonight by Geo. W. Curtis - but the ice was not fit to carry & I did not go. Have been at Albany all day - Mailed a letter for E. this morning

SATURDAY 14

Went to Albany at 9 O'clock - Heard Lecture from J. H. Harris & spent most of the day looking up my ears - took dinner with Hobbs - Lizzie recd letter from Otis

FEBRUARY

SUNDAY 15

1857

Heard Dr. Gregory preach this morning

MONDAY 16

Was at Albany & attended "Moor Court" The river broke up again this afternoon.

Have finished "My race" It is the best of Bulwer's except the "Crestons" - but is in my estimation far below the best of Dickens. The clown Gork will keep out now & then
 Recd letter & money from Father

I recd. a letter from E. this morning. - Case been Albany all day came up in Bus & Mote Mrs Lee & Mother
