GENERAL OLIVER OTIS HOWARD: Civil War Papers (University of Vermont)

The Collection

The bulk of General Howard's personal papers is at Bowdoin College. The materials here consist of military reports, military circulars and orders from 1861 through 1865. Some of the papers are manuscripts; others are printed, and all cover a wide range of topics during the Civil War. Collection consists of one document box and was a gift of General Howard.

The Collection

About half of the General Oliver Otis Howard Collection of Writings and Family Papers fall between the years 1850 and 1909, when General Howard died. There are only a few letters by or to General Howard in this group, and the bulk of these materials are notes and texts of articles and speeches by Howard in the 1890's-1900's. Also included are various newspaper clippings and miscellaneous biographical materials pertaining to Howard. The remaining papers are mostly Howard family letters, primarily from the years 1927-36, including a large amount of correspondence concerning the erection of a monument in General Howard's honor at the site of the Battle of Gettysburg.
